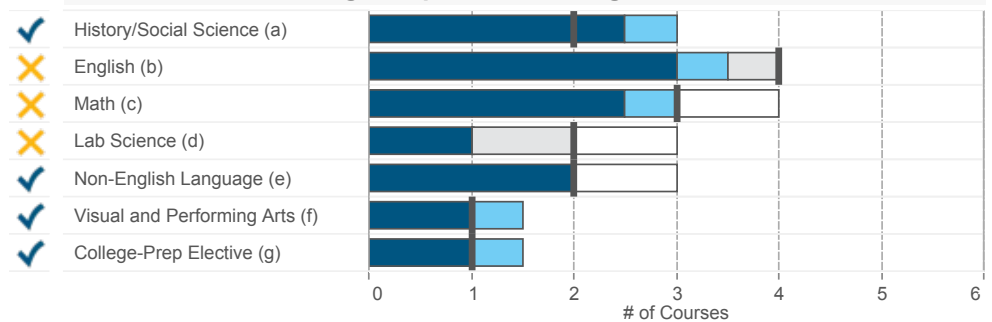

CSU College-Prep Course-Taking as of 12th Grade

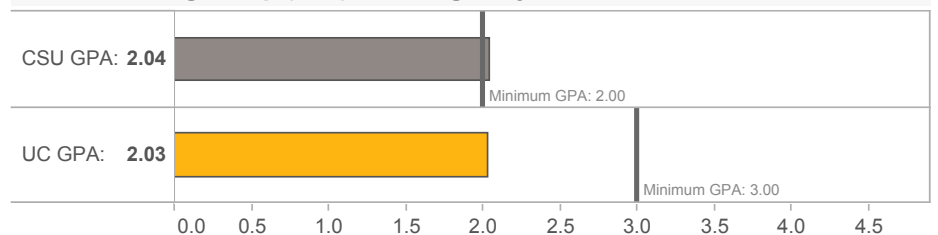


Eligibility Status

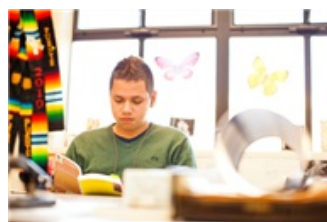

More than two-thirds of UC undergraduates receive grants and scholarships (money that doesn't have to be paid back). And half of UC's undergraduate students pay no tuition at all. Regardless of your income, UC will help you find a way to afford a college education.

For California residents whose families earn less than \$80,000, UC's Blue and Gold Opportunity Plan covers system-wide tuition and fees. Other aid can help pay for living expenses, like food and housing.

Even higher-earning families have options. The Middle Class Scholarship Program and low-interest education loans can make borrowing manageable.
